Introductions

Administrative

A membership review was gone over by Paul (Woody) Woodward. Numbers are up. Some from out of state. He is going over the database and contacting teams and Sheriff Offices who are not current members. Need to ensure e-mails we have are correct.

Legislative

Howard Paul – the legislative session is over next Wednesday. The bill was passed to ensure the confidentiality of QA discussions with staff and review. Bill protecting responders who care for animals during a mission. Need to have policies and practices in place. Can only be used when the primary focus of the emissions is for human subjects.

Assault of EMS providers – Bill to make same as a police officer.

Standards F32 ASTM – guide released on administrative process for giving out certifications. F3069-14

Training Report

Leonard Ginther – 36 total students in the last 3 MLSO classes. Nothing pending at this time.

Tim Holden – do we need our volunteers to have Hazmat Awareness training? Internal/external training? Would CSRB sponsor a course once a year? Tim will look into it and work on it. OEM has a point of contact for Tim.

Insurance

Paul “Woody” Woodward met with the insurance folks of CTSI. He wants to create a document explaining Workers Comp coverage for inclusion in the newsletter. Supplement to cover items not covered by Workers Comp.

Woody to send a copy of the MOU to the Directors.

Organizational Reports

MRA – George Janson, Mike McDonald, and Bruce Fosdick are going to the meeting.

Trackers – Upcoming in Lusk WY in June as well as class in Ft. Collins in Sept. Monthly trainings in Teller and Larimer County.

CAP – discussions ongoing on PLB beacons. The homing side is going away.

2015 Joint Conference

CSRB/MRA/NASAR joint conference for 2015. 4 of the 5 RFPs are back to NASAR. CO School of Mines not in. Location and time will be announced at the next conference. NASAR director will want to do a site visit.

Bylaw Committee

Workin gon a lot of wording changes to the CSRB bylaws – membership, requirements, meetings, elections, etc. Do we want to reduce the directors to 9?

Mission Reports/Lessons Learned

Garfield – downed paraglider last fall with back injuries. Was a good move bringing in HAATS. A lot of training is being done around this. Looking to put out a training video.

Park – helped with plane in the reservoir in Ridgeway.

Pueblo – has a new Emergency Readiness Center

Douglas – quiet win ter. County signed contract for helo. Now cannot request military helo unless this helo is unavailable. It is a wildland fire bird.

RMRG – reminder that accidents can happen after the patient is already out. Possible suicide where known to be armed. Found within ¼ mile of car.

Alpine – people making poor, unprepared decisions. Lots of planning going into the mission after the initial push.

Possible meeting at the HAATS facility with training. Woody checking into it.
